- 1_3 cup white wine
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup cognac
- 1 cup heavy cream
- ¹/₂ cup veal demi-glace (optional)
- Butter and olive oil
- Salt


SENIOR PROM MEMORIES

CELEBRATING MILESTONES



A DREAM BIG COME TRUE!


