

If that wasn't sweet enough, they wowed with a Sticky Toffee Pudding — bread pudding with crème anglaise and pecan praline — earning "Best Appetizer" and "Best Dessert!"

"BEST APPETIZER" WINNING RECIPE:

Fish and Chip Cake with Green Goddess Tartar sauce

INGREDIENTS: FISH AND CHIP CAKE

- 1lb cod fish, steamed and flaked
- ¼ cup scallion, finely chopped
- 1 cup crushed potato chips
- ½ cup panko
- ¹/₄ cup breadcrumbs
- 3 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 2 tsp dry mustard
- 2 tbsp lemon juice
- ¹/₄ tsp cayenne pepper
- ¼ tsp Kosher salt
- ½ tsp black pepper
- 2 egg
- 1½ tsp butter
- 1½ tsp vegetable oil
- Truffle salt for seasoning (when cakes come out of the pan)

INGREDIENTS: GREEN GODDESS TARTAR SAUCE

- ¼ cup chopped cornichons
- 2½ tbsp rinsed and chopped capers
- 1 small shallot, chopped
- ¹⁄₂ cup mayonnaise
- 1 tsp Dijon
- 2 tbsp chopped tarragon
- 1½ tbsp chopped dill
- 2 tbsp chopped parsley
- 2 tbsp chopped chives
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- ½ tsp freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup olive oil



DIRECTIONS: FISH AND CHIP CAKE

- In a large bowl, place cod, scallions and ¼ cup breadcrumbs. Mix very lightly.
- In a small bowl, mix mayonnaise, mustard, lemon juice, cayenne pepper, salt, pepper, and 1 egg, then whip together until smooth.
- 3. Pour the mayonnaise mixture over the cod mixture and lightly fold together.
- 4. Gently shape into 20 cakes (about 2½ inches in diameter). Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes to an hour.
- 5. Use three pans: place flour in one, a beaten egg in another, and the panko and crushed chips mixed together in the third. Dip each cake first in the flour, then the egg, and finally in the panko-chip mixture. Set aside after coating.
- 6. Heat oil and butter in a skillet over medium heat. When tiny bubbles appear, add the cakes.
- 7. Cook for 2-3 minutes per side until golden brown.
- 8. Serve with the Green Goddess Tartar sauce.

DIRECTIONS: GREEN GODDESS TARTAR SAUCE

- Coarsely chop the cornichons, capers, and shallot. Place it in a food processor and pulse a few times to combine.
- Add mayonnaise, mustard, herbs, lemon juice, and pepper and process for about 6 seconds to blend well.
- 3. Scrape down the sides and pulse a few more times. Open the pour spout and slowly drizzle in the olive oil while the motor runs.
- 4. Transfer the tartar sauce to an air-tight container and refrigerate until ready to use.

Let's face it," Heather Nalbock, **Community Specialist at Independence** Village of Petoskey continued, "navigating family dynamics when facing difficult topics can be challenging, even for the best of families. Audience members left the event feeling heard, but more importantly, they were empowered. That's our mission with the Aging Gracefully Symposium - to bring helpful experts and families together so Northern **Michigan families** have support and resources they need."

A Word from Our Resident

We sat down with Ruth Grass, a resident from Independence Village of Petoskey in Petoskey, Michigan, to hear more about her senior living experience.

Tell us about yourself.

"My name is Ruth Grass, and I moved into Independence Village a year ago with my husband, Peter, who was in the early stages of Alzheimer's. We are both in our late 70s."

Why did you decide to move to senior living?

"People told me that we were way too young to go into a senior living community, and I should stay at home, and I should get help to take care of Peter. There were parts of me that liked that idea, but the weight of the house and the maintenance issues brought me to the decision that it was time to move."

How did you feel once you moved?

"Our three-story house was a big burden because I was taking it on by myself. I was struggling with all the upkeep and maintenance... When we sold the house and let go of everything, except what would fit into 817 square feet, I felt a lot lighter in many ways. It felt like freedom. And guess who else felt relieved? Our four sons."



How are you both doing now?

"Now it's 12 months since moving into Independence Village. Peter is in a more accelerated decline as his neurologist predicted, and I'm so grateful that I made that decision to move in when I did. When we think it's too soon, it's probably just the right time."

What has Peter's diagnosis taught you?

"Well, I've learned to say I love you more, to hold hands more, to find daily moments of close connectedness more. One of the more difficult things for me was accepting life as it gives it to me, just as it is, whether I like it or not.

I started a support group here in the village for caregivers. Knowing we are not alone in this journey is so helpful and a great advantage of living in a caring village. Most important of all, I've learned to be brokenhearted on one hand and grateful in the other. It's really learning that those two hands are perfect together."
















GOING FOR THE GOLD ... AT STORYPOINT UNION
